Learn how to use distance education technologies and case studies in your teacher education courses through specific strategies of CaseNET. CaseNET is a set of courses designed by faculty at the University of Virginia and delivered to college and university students, inservice teachers, teachers' aides, and school administrators via the Internet (World Wide Web, video conference, discussion groups, and electronic mail), videotape, and print materials. Faculty use case methods—similar to instructional approaches used in business, law and medicine—to bridge educational theory and real-life practice in schools.

We will be working in collaboration with faculty at the University of Nebraska at Omaha. You will participate in discussion groups, analyze a case, and also interact with faculty at the University of Virginia via video conferencing and the Internet. The focus of the case featured in this training will be multicultural issues in K-12 school settings.
